

1. Military Police organizations and personnel, in addition to those already attached to tactical units, will be organized and temporarily assigned as follows:

The units assigned as above, will be organized as prescribed in Sec. Ill, Par. 3 (b), (c), (d) and (e) of G. O. No. 180, c.s., these headquarters.

The remaining authorized strength of the Military Police Corps will be organized by the Provost Marshal General into battalions and smaller units of such strength as he may deem advisable; provided, however, that no company shall exceed the strength indicated in Sec. Ill, Par. 3 (b), G. O. No. 180, c.s., these headquarters. For this purpose he will, as occasion demands, notify the A. G., A. E. F., as to the number of officers and soldiers required, and they will be supplied of the prescribed standards.

2. (a) The commanders of the District of Paris, of headquarters S. O. S., and of the sections of the S. O. S., will, before November 20, 1918, reorganize the Military Police of their respective commands into battalions, companies and office detachments as indicated in Par. 1 hereof.

(b) Transfers to the units to be organized will be made from the commissioned and enlisted personnel of any present Military Police units or from qualified members of other units or corps. Each individual thus transferred should be over 21 years of age, at least 5 feet 7 inches in height, with proportionate weight, and of sufficient education and intelligence to write reports and draw up charges correctly and to read maps understandingly. In general, a private of the M. P. C. must possess, in marked degree, all of the qualities usually required of a non-commissioned officer.

(c) Variations from the above physical requirements are authorized when in the best interests of the service.

(d) Immediately upon completion of this reorganization, report will be made by wire direct to the Provost Marshal General, giving the names and rank of the officers assigned to units, and the names and rank of the officers and the number of soldiers in each grade remaining as surplus. If there is no surplus, this fact will be reported. At the same time, a complete roster of the new organization will be mailed to the Provost Marshal General.

3. Promotions of provost marshals and assistant provost marshals will be made only at these headquarters, and the recommendation of the Provost Marshal General, who is authorized to assign and transfer them when, in his opinion, the circumstances may require.

4. The companies of the Military Police Corps organized pursuant to G. O. No. 180, c.s., these headquarters, will be assigned as follows:

To each division, 1 company;

To each army corps, 1 company;

To each army, 4 companies organized as 1 battalion.

Remaining companies will be distributed and transferred by the Provost Marshal General from time to time in such manner as conditions may require.

Military police companies and battalions will be designated as follows:

Companies assigned to divisions, by the numerical designation of the division, for example: 1st Division, 1st M. P. Co.; 27th Division, 27th M. P. Co.

Companies assigned to army corps, by the corps designation, for example: 1st Corps, 1st Corps M. P. Co.

Battalions, assigned to armies, by the army designation, for example: 1st Army, 1st Army M. P. Battalion, Companies A, B, C and D.

Remaining units will be designated by the Provost Marshal General.

5. Members of the Military Police Corps will perform no duties except those appropriate to their organization. Outside of their own organization, they will not be used as orderlies, guards over prisoners, ordinary guards, on fatigue duty, court-martial duty, or other similar duty.

6. Whenever requisitions for students are made by the Provost Marshal General on the commanders of military police units, the required number of officers and men will be sent to the M. P. C. Training Depot. Officers and men, on graduating from the M. P. C. training course, will be assigned by the Provost Marshal General in such a manner as, in his opinion, the circumstances require.

7. Non-commissioned officers in the Military Police Corps will be appointed and promoted on the recommendation of their immediate commanders as follows: Units at Army Headquarters--By the army provost, marshal; All units in army corps--By the corps provost marshal;

All other units--By the provost marshal under whose orders they are serving; Each private in

the Military Police Corps will have the assimilated rank of acting corporal, and will be respected and obeyed accordingly.

8. The Provost Marshal General is authorized to detach and transfer individuals and units of the Military Police Corps, not attached to combat units, and to direct, as necessary in the military service, such travel for himself", his subordinates and M. P. units as, from time to time, may be necessary.

9. Officers of the M. P. C. will, when on duty at army, army corps, divisions, section, district, or other headquarters, where M. P. units are attached, be designated as provost marshals, and their subordinate officers as assistant provost marshals. Under like circumstances, officers of other organizations, who may be attached to the M. P. C. for duty, will be designated as acting provost marshals and acting assistant provost marshals.

10. All of the provisions of G. O. No. 180, c.s., these headquarters, will apply to the organizations herein provided.

11. So much of G. O. No. 29, 1917; G. O. No. 30, 1917; Sec. I, G. O. No. 71, 1917; G. O. No. 31, 1918; Sec. II, G. O. No. 43, 1918, and Sec. III, G. O. No. 158, 1918, these headquarters, as conflicts with the provisions of this order, is revoked.
